In ancient China, the Horse-face skirt was one of the notable skirts for women and maintained its typical style of women's dress during the Ming and Qing dynasties. With the passage of history and the revival of traditional Chinese culture, it has begun to arouse interest in traditional Chinese dress. Among them, Hanfu, including the Horse-face skirt, has attracted significant attention in modern dress, where ancient design elements are combined with modern dress. Different grades of Horse-face skirts are different in color and material. The different decorations on the Horse-face skirts also sent out different wishes of the ancients. For example, in the Song Dynasty court, the Horse-face skirt was usually regarded as an important part of women's clothing and was regarded as a symbol of nobility and elegance.

In the Ming and Qing dynasties, Horse-face skirts were the same in terms of shape and manufacturing process. The difference lies in that, based on inheriting the Ming system, the Qing Dynasty's Horse-face skirt became more complicated and decorative. This is in line with the great development and prosperity of the Qing Dynasty [4]. According to Qi, Z.Y, during the Ming and Qing Dynasties, Horse-face skirts underwent great changes in four aspects [5]. The first is to increase the binding and strengthen the rectangular structure of the placket. The second is that there are more diverse changes in the two ribs, and there are many types. The third is to use solid color satin patchwork on the material. The fourth is the integration of religious beliefs into the design of Horse-face skirts.

With the continuous advancement of modern technology and the continuous enrichment of clothing materials, Horse-face skirts are gradually divided into two basic shapes: dry skirts and pleated skirts. In terms of production technology, the cutting and laying out method of the dried skirt is ingenious, which is the embodiment of people's thought of cherishing things at that time. The connection of fabrics does not have too many complicated processes. In addition, the use of dried satin edge has the function of preventing silk from falling off. It also has the decorative effect of an integrated pattern [6].

2.2. Re-popular of the Horse-face Skirt

In 2022, a Dior skirt with a price tag of 29,000 yuan caused controversy on social media, bringing people back to the traditional Chinese costume Horse-face skirt. In the 21st century, with the Internet as the medium, the Hanfu movement emerged, advocating the inheritance and development of Chinese culture, and the Horse-face skirt has been promoted to a certain extent. The revival of Hanfu takes various forms. In society, mainly young people start to wear Hanfu in their daily lives.

There will be clubs and lectures on Hanfu on campus to let students know more about traditional Chinese clothing and culture. The promotion of Hanfu can also be integrated into music, and many videos and documentaries promoting Hanfu have appeared on social media. The market and scale of Hanfu continue to expand in the 21st century.

Contemporary designers pay attention to the innovation and development of traditional clothing. For example, the new Hanfu will abandon the cumbersome wearing steps and make the way of wearing clothing simple and convenient. The design of contemporary Hanfu embodies the combination of ancient and modern, Chinese and Western. Belgian designer Dries Van Noten transformed the appliqué structure of the Qing Dynasty Horse-face skirt into a fabric pattern in the Fall/Winter 2012 Paris Fashion Week, and applied it to fashion design, using the techniques of cutting and splicing into the shape of the garment to create a new visual impact [8]. Additionally, the development of modern technology has guaranteed the large-scale popularity of Hanfu, allowing more and more people to experience Hanfu culture.

Chinese traditional costumes provide a reference for contemporary trends and lead the development of contemporary trends to a certain extent.
